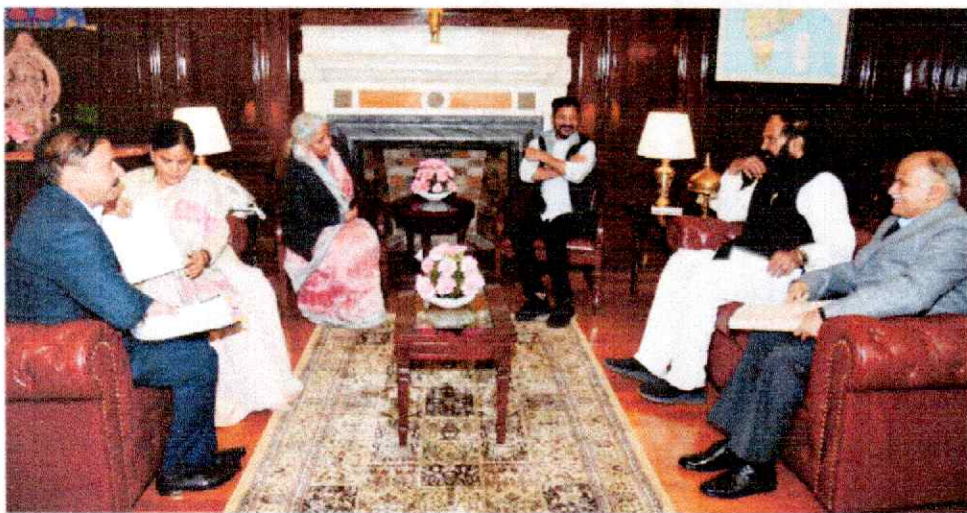

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Revanth Reddy urges Sitharaman to release pending funds, Rajnath to transfer land



Hyderabad, Jan 5 (IANS) Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy on Friday met Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in the national capital and requested her to release pending funds to the state. He urged her to release Rs 1,800 crore to

Telangana for the backward areas development under the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act.

Telangana has to get Rs 450 crore every year for the development of backward areas, but the Centre has not released the

funds for the last three financial years. The Chief Minister, who was accompanied by Irrigation Minister Utam Kumar Reddy, also requested the finance minister to release Rs 2,233.54 crore to Telangana under 15th Finance Commission. He

also sought special funds from the Centre for development of Hyderabad. Revanth Reddy also called on Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and urged him to transfer the defence lands to the state for development of roads and elevated

corridors in Hyderabad.

He requested the Defence Minister to order transfer of 0.21 hectares defence land for construction of a skywalk to ease traffic congestion at Mehdiapatnam. According to the Chief Minister's Office, the Defence Minister responded positively to the request. The Chief Minister also requested for transfer of 83 acres of land for development of 11.30 km-long six-lane elevated corridor to connect Hyderabad to Rajiv Rahadari (Kannamgar-Ramagundam road).

Similarly, he also urged the Defence Minister to transfer 56 acres of defence land to the state for construction of a 12.68 km-long elevated corridor from Paradise Junction to Outer Ring Road to facilitate easy movement of traffic towards Nagpur highway.

2 ED officials injured in mob attack, forced to flee for their lives

Kolkata, Jan 5 (UNI) : Two Enforcement Directorate (ED) officials were injured, one of them sustaining head injury, after they were attacked by a mob during a raid at a Trinamool Congress leader's residence in West Bengal's Sandeshkhali in connection with the alleged ration distribution scam. The ED officials were forced to retreat fearing for their lives, official sources said. The attackers are said to be the followers of TMC leader Sahjahan Sheikh.

The mob attacked the ED officials, who were aided by the central forces, when they tried to break open the collapsible gates, which were locked from inside.

The officials, finding their vehicles were vandalised, fled from the locality in North 24 Parganas district on auto rickshaw and steamer Sahjahan, who was an executive in the state fisheries and animal husbandry department in the locality, is considered to be a close associate of arrested minister Jyotipriyo Mallick. Currently the forest Minister, Mallick earlier held the food portfolio for ten years, and has been arrested in connection with the alleged multi-crore rupee ration distribution scam.

Some members of the media covering the raid were also attacked by the mob. The attackers vandalised the gadgets and vehicles of the mediapersons, sources said. Meanwhile, two teams of ED officials also raided the properties of the former Benagan municipal chairman Shankar Adde.

ISRO successfully tests FCPS in orbital platform POEM-3

Chennai, Jan 5 (UNI) :

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has successfully tested a 100 W class Polymer Electrolyte Membrane Fuel Cell based Power System (FCPS) in its orbital platform, POEM3, launched onboard PSLV-C58 on January one. The objective of the experiment was to assess Polymer Electrolyte Membrane Fuel cell operation in space and to collect data to facilitate the design of systems for future missions. During the short duration test onboard POEM, 180 W power was generated from Hydrogen and Oxygen gases stored on onboard in high pressure vessels. It provided a wealth of data on performance of various static and dynamic systems that formed part of

TSRTC prepares for Sankranti with 4,484 special buses and additional facilities

Hyderabad, Jan 5 : The Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TSRTC) is gearing up for the festive rush during Sankranti by arranging special measures for the convenience of travelers.

In a significant move, the TSRTC will operate 4,484 special buses to ensure safe journeys for individuals heading home for the Sankranti festival. Reservation options have been made available for 626 of these services. The special buses will be in service from January 7 to 15.

In a review meeting held at Hyderabad Bus Bhawan on Friday, TSRTC MD VC Sajjanar, along with senior officials, discussed the

amenities provided to passengers, a TSRTC statement said.

Sajjanar emphasized that preparations, including the implementation of the Maha Lakshmi scheme, are in full swing to accommodate the increased passenger flow during Sankranti. Special buses will operate in congested areas of Hyderabad, such as MGBS, JBS, Uppal Cross Roads, Arangan, LB Nagar Cross Roads, KPHB, Bowinipally, Gachibowli, etc. For the convenience of passengers in these areas, arrangements such as pandals, shamanias, chairs, public address systems, drinking water facilities, and mobile toilets are being set up.

The TSRTC clarified that special buses to various parts of Andhra Pradesh for Sankranti will operate as scheduled, and there will be no increase in bus fares for the festival. Cabinet approves to name Ayodhya Airport as Maharishi Valmiki International Airport, Ayodhyadham

New Delhi, Jan 5 (UNI): The Cabinet has approved the proposal to declare Ayodhya Airport as an International Airport and naming it as "Maharishi Valmiki International Airport Ayodhyadham" on Friday here. This decision is paramount for realizing Ayodhya's economic potential and its significance as a global pilgrimage site, opening doors to foreign pilgrims and tourists, an official statement said.

The airport's name, "Maharishi Valmiki International Airport, Ayodhyadham," pays homage to Maharishi Valmiki, the sage attributed to composing the epic Ramayana, adding a cultural touch to the

airport's identity.

The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has also approved the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between India and the United States for International Development (USAID) for supporting Indian Railways to achieve Mission Net Zero Carbon Emission. The MoU will provide a platform for Indian Railways to interact and share the latest developments and knowledge in the railway sector. It will facilitate utility modernization, advanced energy solutions and systems, regional energy and market integration and private sector participation and engagement, training and seminars focusing on

specific technology areas like Renewable Energy, energy efficiency and other interactions for knowledge sharing. In an effort to strengthen bilateral trade and foster investment with Guyana, the Cabinet approved the signing of MoU between the Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas, Government of India and the Ministry of Natural Resources, Republic of Guyana on cooperation in the hydrocarbon sector.

This initiative will provide an opportunity to Indian company to participate in E&P sector of Guyana, gaining experience by working with global oil and gas companies in upstream projects, thus fostering the vision of "Atmanirbhar Bharat" the

official statement said.

In another decision, the Cabinet approved the overarching scheme "PRITHVI Vigyan (PRITHVI)" of Ministry of Earth Sciences, for implementation during the period from 2021-26 at an overall cost of Rs. 4,797 crores. The scheme encompasses five ongoing sub-schemes namely "Atmosphere & Climate Research-Modelling Observing Systems & Services (ACROSS)", "Ocean Services, Modelling Application, Resources and Technology (O-SMART)", "Polar Science and Cryosphere Research (PACER)", "Seismology and Geosciences (SAGE)" and "Research, Education,

Training and Outreach (REACHOUT)".

It has also approved the Memorandum of Understanding between Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) and Mauritius Research and Innovation Council (MRIC) concerning cooperation on the development of a Joint Small Satellite.

This MoU will help to establish a framework for cooperation between ISRO and MRIC on the development of a joint satellite as well as for cooperation on the use of the MRIC's Ground Station. Some of the subsystems for the joint satellite will be taken up through the participation of Indian industries and would benefit the industry.

Manipur Govt probe Lilong



Imphal, Jan 5 (Waari Singbul Network): The state government has constituted a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to inquire into Monday evening's firing at the minority-dominated Lilong area in Thoubal district even as the death toll in the incident rose to 5 as one of the injured breathed his last. Md Abdur Rajaq, who received critical bullet wounds, passed away at the private Raj Medicity in Imphal on Wednesday. A Lilong resident, Rajaq was a key functionary of Anjuman, a local anti-drug body. On the other hand, the Joint Action Committee (JAC) formed by residents of Lilong, predominantly settled by Meitei Pangals (Meitei Muslims) in connection with the incident, agreed to claim the bodies for performing last rites.

Aizawl, Jan 5 (UNI): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Thursday assured Mizoram Chief Minister Lalduhoma that Myanmar refugees who are sheltering in the state will not be sent back until and unless peace is restored in the neighbouring country.

Shah said this when Lalduhoma called on him at the latter's office in Delhi yesterday afternoon.

The Home Minister expressed the centre's intention before the CM of not to send back the 31,573 refugees from Myanmar taking refuge in Mizoram.

Strife impedes Jal Jeevan Mission as water crisis looms over Manipur



Imphal, Jan 5 (DIPR): In Manipur, the ambitious goal of extending safe drinking water to 4.5 lakh households by this year, under the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), has hit a staggering roadblock—a conflict stretching over eight months, crippling the state's progress.

Launched in 2019 with a budget of Rs 3,137.42 crore, predominantly funded by the central government (90%), the JJM implementation is stuck at a mere 77%, struggling to overcome hurdles posed by ongoing ethnic conflicts.

Shangreiphao Vashumwo, Chief Engineer of Manipur's Public Health Engineering Department (PHED), shed light on the

Sanitation Committees, crucial for comprehensive rural coverage, further delaying on-ground implementation, Vashumwo lamented. Despite serving Imphal and its environs, requiring 124 MLD (million litres per Day) of water daily, through 17 water treatment plants, disruptions in conflict-affected zones like Kangchup, Kangchup extension, and Potshangbam-II, coupled with sabotage at the Singda treatment plant's pipeline, severely curtailed water supply. Vashumwo expressed determination to reinstate work in these conflict areas by engaging local youths from neutral communities on contractual terms. Additionally, plans to complete pipeline replacements and construct

potability."

Collaborative efforts involving governmental bodies, community engagement, and strategic interventions are pivotal to surmounting these obstacles and ensuring the timely completion of this critical project.

In parallel, Tourangbam Brajakumar, in-charge director of Manipur's Environment and Climate Change Department, highlighted a looming crisis arising from the drying up of springs and the disappearance of wetlands, contributing significantly to the state's water scarcity issue. Brajakumar stressed the necessity of a governmental policy focusing on spring revival

consistent rainfall in Manipur over recent years, yet highlighted a shortened monsoon period lasting two to three months, leading to intense but brief rainfall. This disrupts groundwater recharge, exacerbated by deforestation in hill catchment areas, causing spring desiccation and river water volume reduction.

"Nearly 62 percent of springs in the state have dried up due to this phenomenon," Brajakumar disclosed, underscoring the urgency of a policy addressing spring revival to alleviate the water crisis.

Highlighting the critical role of wetlands in environmental purification, Brajakumar mourned a drastic reduction in wetland numbers—from 550 to a mere 119, contributing significantly to the adverse climatic conditions prevailing in the state.

To tackle this issue, the department is actively engaged in rejuvenating existing wetlands, aiming to mitigate the escalating environmental challenges.

The drying springs and vanishing wetlands, exacerbated by conflict-driven project delays, paint a grim picture of Manipur's impending water crisis.

supply supply of critical materials needed for the project's execution.

The conflict severely hampered the momentum of the project, obstructing material transportation from outside the state, mentioned Ashamwa, emphasizing the acute challenges encountered due to these disruptions.

Notably, logistical difficulties in conflict zones hindered the establishment of Village Water and

sanitation to enhance water distribution efficiency.

The scarcity of government-supplied water forced households to rely on private vendors, purchasing approximately 500 liters monthly at Rs 350 per 1000 liters—an exorbitant expense. Concerns about the procured water's safety persist, with no established government measures to monitor its quality, raising doubts about its

ability to ensure a sustainable water cycle and avert an acute potable water shortage.

While regions like Rajasthan and Delhi, with minimal annual rainfall (200mm and 400mm respectively), sustain sufficient water supply throughout the year, Manipal receiving 1600mm annual rainfall, grapples with water scarcity—an anomaly," stated Brajakumar.

He emphasized the unaltered water cycle and

risks, his situation may exacerbate, impacting the lives of its residents and the region's ecological balance.

The conflict's ripple effects on vital water infrastructure and the looming specter of dried springs and vanishing wetlands paint a stark picture of an impending water crisis. Immediate policy interventions and concerted efforts are imperative to avert the looming catastrophe

SC seeks Delhi LG's response on AAP Govt's allegations

New Delhi, Jan 7 (ANI) - The Supreme Court on Friday asked Delhi Lieutenant Governor VK Saxena to make his stand clear on the AAP Government's allegations that the funds meant for the free medical treatment for road accident victims under Parshley scheme have been stopped.

The Court said, that if it is found that the Delhi government took the

Court for a ride, exemplary cost will be imposed on them.

A bench comprising Justice BR Gavai and Justice Sandeep Mehta asked the LG to file an affidavit within two weeks after senior advocate Sanjay Jain representing Saxena submitted that the office of LG was not involved in the matter.

The Apex Court was hearing a petition filed by

the Delhi government against the LG alleging that due to the stoppage of funds for the scheme for the past year, unpaid dues of ₹ 17 crore payable to private hospitals had mounted.

On December 8, the Top court issued notice and sought a response from LG on the plea of the Delhi Government that the Parshley scheme launched in 2018 that had

benefitted approximately 28,000 road accident victims required to be re-operationalised.

The Senior Advocate informed the Court that "It is not a matter where there was an issue between the Council of Ministers and LG." The scheme is run by a society headed by the Delhi Health Minister.

It is the Health Minister who conducted a meeting on January 2 for

The Court said, "File an affidavit to this effect. If we find the Minister has taken us for a ride, we will impose an exemplary cost." The Court even remarked, "Ask your LG not to make every issue a prestige issue."

LeT militant

Shimoga, Jan 7 (ANI) - Security forces shot dead a LeT militant in an encounter that broke out in Jammu Kashmir's Shopian district on morning, police said.

The slain militant identified Ahmed Bhat, a resident of Chek was allegedly involved in the terror crimes. Police said as per its records, the slain militant was involved in the abduction of Lieutenant Umer Fayaz of Kullgam in 2017. Lieutenant Fayaz was abducted by several militants from his relative's house in Shopian on Monday. Besides the killing of the young officer, the slain LeT ultra Bhat, accused by police of hurling a bomb upon non-local labourers in Shopian, resulting in on spot death in October 2022.

He was also involved in the Kashmiri pandit Sunil Kumar injuring other Kashmiri pandit P Nath, both residents of Chotgam.
